Bijou Bike Park - Not Just For Kids!

Before the snow flew and after a mountain bike ride up to Star Lake, I stopped by Bijou Bike Park in South Lake Tahoe one Sunday to see what Bijou Bike Park Association, TAMBA, and the City of SLT had built.

I wondered if I'd feel out of place there on a geared mountain bike and wearing lycra, but the vibe is fun and friendly. No one else wore lycra, but about half the riders were adults, and most of them were on geared mountain bikes, though some had BMX bikes.

There are three slopestyle lines: beginner, intermediate, and holy cow.

I spent my time on the small slopestyle line, which is a series of dirt and wood rollers, berms, table top jumps, and some small wood ramps that end in small drops. The highest wood-slat roller looks much steeper from the rider's viewpoint than it looks from the side; it's fun to watch kids new to it almost stall out at the top - this teaches the onlooker to maintain momentum riding over it. The line ends with the world's easiest teeter-totter, and a log ride on the return "loop trail" is the least intimidating log you'll ever ride.

A few different dirt pump tracks will test your "pumping" skills around a series of rollers. Riders doing it well it make it look really easy, as they go round and round without pedaling. I had to pedal more than I care to admit, especially on the uphill halves of the loops. One guy was pumping an old cyclocross bike.

There's also a fun BMX track whose high starting gate lets you gain speed quickly for the big rollers and very steep banked berms to come.

Transportation Bill

Yes - a new Transportation Bill comes out of Congress!! - Good news on the bicycle funding side, as last Friday afternoon, December 4th, President Obama signed a five-year U.S. transportation bill called "Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act" or for short - FAST Act. It passed both houses on Congress by wide margins. FAST offers some good news on the bicycle front as funding has been preserved for bicycling and walking programs. Also a few policy improvements were included, like adding in Complete Streets. Local programs such as Safe Routes to School have also been retained. A small increase in funding for bicycling was raised slightly to \$835 million annually the first two years and then to \$850 million annually the last three years. Most of the bicycle funding resides in the old Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) which now is renamed Surface Transportation Program (STP) 'Set-aside'. One positive change is that nonprofits are now eligible to apply for STP Set-aside funding. The successful TAP competitive structure with shared decision-making between state departments of transportation and metropolitan planning organizations was also maintained under that STP Set-aside. Not a total perfect bill but at least we now have a long term transportation bill and bicycling did not take a hit.

Acronyms are great aren't they – first we had SAFETEA-LU (Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users) in 2005, then MAP-21 (Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century) in 2012 and now FAST. Note that earlier versions of FAST included GROW AMERICA and DRIVE.

AMGEN Tour 2016

AMGEN-Tour of California returns to Lake Tahoe in 2016 – In case you have not heard - The men will race from Lodi, CA up Hwy 88 and Hwy 89 to Heavenly in South Lake Tahoe on Thursday May 19 on stage 5. Men will continue with Stage 6 Time Trial in Folsom and Stage 7 in Santa Rosa with Stage 8 and the finish in Sacramento.

The Women will also race at the same time - around Lake Tahoe the same day on stage 1. Stage 2 Women is also a Time Trial in Folsom, Stage 3 in Santa Rosa and Stage 4 in Sacramento. Should be a great and exciting period of racing in our area – please come out and support the sport and in our back yard. We also hope it does not snow that day, like we all remember the first time. Meeting called to order at 6:15 pm Venue: Jethro's – Gardnerville Ranchos

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
 - **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is: \$43,425.29. The PayPal account balance is \$2047.01.
 - Membership: Michael reported no changes from previous membership levels.
 - Weekend Rides: Garth reported the ride kit has been returned to the shed.
 - Newsletter: Newsletter is anticipated to be distributed on Wednesday (Dec. 9) pm.
 - Website: Existing web site is being updated. Dennis Pederson is updating the Challenge registration portion of the site. Options continue to be explored for finding another web host and to develop a site coded in Square Space, Word Press, or a similar type of coding program, which will allow directors to individually edit their pages. For example, the Road Race directly would have the ability to update the road race portion of the web site directly.
 - Weekly Road Races: Di asks for suggestions of possible new venues for Thursday night road races. Directors offered suggestions, but the membership is encouraged to participate as well.
 - Mountain Bike Races: The position of Mountain Bike Coordinator is open. The Board of Directors would be most grateful for a volunteer to step forward and fill the position. Contact President Chris Rhiner.
 - Junior Team: Mel is planning 16 weekly indoor sessions with the juniors on rollers.
 - · Spring Century: No report.
 - Pinenut Cracker: The 2016 event is tentatively scheduled for May 21st (a Saturday). The event will be USAC sanctioned. Robert reported that 51 riders participated in this year's event. The Douglas County Fairgrounds Pavilion will not be rented for the 2016 event.
 - Cyclocross Race: The Davis Creek Cyclocross race was a success with a record turnout of participants. Robert reported proceeds of \$411 which were spent on prizes.

- Bike Advocacy: Congress has passed a five year transportation bill named the FAST Act (Fixing America's Surface Transportation).
 Bicycle/pedestrian programs received a slight increase in funding. A recent meeting was held regarding bicycle events at Lake Tahoe. There were 23 people in attendance including representatives from various bicycle groups, NHP, CHP, CalTrans, and NDOT discussing methods of improving safety and the issue of riders not obeying traffic laws.
- · Adopt A Highway: No report
- Clothing: Voler has had a personnel change. Apparently the Voler database of Alta Alpina jerseys was purged. Michael is working with Voler to have the designs restored. There was discussion of having a package membership renewal/jersey purchase, which would result in a substantial discount on the price of a new jersey.
- PR/Publicity: Laura is still doing a few things to help until we find one or more volunteers to help with marketing, publicity, and social media..
- Challenge: An advertising contract has been finalized with Cycle California to run five black and white advertisements for the Challenge starting in January. Challenge posters for 2016 will be delivered from the printer in January. Registration pricing will remain the same as last year. Early bird pricing will be honored until the end of January—possibly longer—TBD.
- Next Meeting: Monday January 11, 2016 by teleconference at 5pm.
