# A Request from Linda Muir





#### Carson City Freeway Interchange - To Bike/Ped or Not to Bike/Ped?

Numerous meetings with NDOT staff, Carson City/CAMPO staff and the public have been held at NDOT and Carson City RTC/CAMPO in December 2013 and January 2014. The meetings were to discuss how to accommodate pedestrians and bicycles through the US50/US395 at-grade intersection (interim condition) in south Carson City. This discussion comes after NDOT recently revised the plans for the interchange. The original interchange will still happen—but at a later date —and an interim at-grade intersection was designed that will be constructed sooner.

This change was at the request of Carson City/ CAMPO. CAMPO (the Carson Area Metropolitan Planning Organization) which includes coverage of the north part of Douglas County and US 50 east to Dayton Valley in Lyon County. The change was asked for in order to reduce costs and to get the last phase of the Carson City Freeway finished to Hwy 395 south sooner. The new date for the completion of the freeway to Hwy 395/50 intersection is tentatively March 2017.

Note that the Hwy 395 southbound traffic pattern to Jacks Valley, Minden and points south really did not change much with this interim design, as both designs have traffic come off the freeway and then turn left at a signal. Hwy 395 northbound will have a two-lane onramp to get on the freeway just past Old Clear Creek Rd. The main affect of the intersection change will be for the Lake Tahoe east and west bound traffic as they will not have a pass over but will have to stop at the signal.

NDOT re-designed the interim intersection according to CAMPO's bike plan, which basically had no bike lanes through the intersection. A sidewalk on the southbound side and 10' wide shoulders on both north and southbound were to be installed. There were concerns brought up to the NDOT Design team by NDOT Bike/Ped staff, members of Muscle Powered and AACC.

The concerns were how to get north bound pedestrians and bicyclist through the intersection safely, with the main concern being getting peds and bicyclists across the multi-lane high speed northbound on-ramp.

Many internal meetings happened at NDOT with the Project Management, Project Design, Bike Ped Planning and Safety Engineering. It was made known that many bicyclists and pedestrians use this interchange, including Glen Lucky and me. Also many

touring bicyclists from all over the world travel the ACA Western Express Route through here. This may also be a future route of the proposed US Bike Route System. Little or no accommodations for bikes/peds have occurred during existing construction.

Note that the project area is on Hwy 395 from Old Creek Road (Costco light) in the south to Appion Way (Chevron station) in the north.

Here's a summary of the meeting's outcome.

#### **US395 Southbound direction:**

Pedestrians will utilize a 10' shared use path on the west side of US395 from Appion to Clear Creek.

Bicyclists will have two options. They will either utilize a 10' shared use path on west side of US395 from Appion to Clear Creek or a 10' shoulder from Appion to Clear Creek.

Bicyclists can also use the marked 395 Bike Route on the east side of hwy 395.

#### **US395 Northbound direction:**

Pedestrians can utilize a 5' sidewalk from Clear Creek to Snyder. At the dual free right, there will be a pedestrian/bicycle signal to provide a safe crossing for pedestrians.

Bicyclists can utilize a 10' shoulder from Clear Creek to Snyder. At the dual free right, bicyclists have two choices and if a gap exists, bicyclists may merge across the dual free right into the painted gore area. Or bicyclists have the option of following the ramp/ shoulder to the pedestrian/bicycle signal, which will return you to the ramp and shoulder further north.

Bicyclists can also use the marked 395 Bike Route on the east side of Hwy 395, which will utilize the new Snyder Ave bridge (which will be completed in March 2014).

# US50 Westbound/Eastbound direction (to/from Lake Tahoe):

In the westbound direction, bicyclists will utilize the 8' shoulder.

In the eastbound to northbound direction, bicyclists will utilize a striped island between the dual left turn lanes and through lanes to make a left to go northbound.

In the eastbound to southbound direction, bicyclists will utilize the right turn lane shoulder to the 10' shoulder in



the southbound direction.

Note that suggestions for bike/ped tunnels under the intersection for north and south bound Hwy 395 were checked out and were found to be very expensive and not within the limited budget for the project. Also there were large issues with having enough space within the ROW (right of way) to construct a proper structure according to ADA (American Disabilities Act). Also there were problems with Carson City water lines, fiber optic cables (recently installed), power lines, lighting and drainage issues.

#### **Next Steps**

This project will be discussed again at the next Carson City CAMPO/RTC meeting at the Community Center in Carson City the afternoon of February 12, 2014.

The next concern for bicyclists and pedestrians in the area is what happens to old Hwy 395-Carson Street from Fairview to Appion Way after the freeway opens. What will Carson City/CAMPO plan to do with the old road?? Hopefully they will change it back from 6 lanes to 4 lanes and have at least wide shoulders. Maybe they also need to extend the shared use path along Hwy 395 to the north from Appion Way and to the south from Old Clear to Jacks Valley Road. Maybe the CAMPO planned shared use path along the new freeway can be completed sooner too.

# Tips for Walking Safely to School

Walking is fun, but you need to be safe while doing it. Follow these tips to make sure you get

#### Walk together

Younger children should always walk with an adult. Tell your parents that walking is great exercise and a nice way to spend time together.

If your parents say that you can walk to school on your own, remember these tips:

- · Walk with a friend when possible.
- Ask your parents to help you pick a safe route to school; one that avoids dangers.
- . Stick to the route you picked with your parents. Don't let friends talk you into shortcuts that are more dangerous.
- When you are near the street, don't push, shove, or chase each other.
- Never hitchhike or take rides from people not arranged by your parents
- Talk to your parents and teacher about any bullying that may happen during your walk.

Remember, drivers may not be able to see you well. Always wear bright-colored clothes and if it is dark or hard to see, carry flashlights or wear reflective gear.

#### Look for traffic

Watch out for cars and trucks at every driveway and intersection on your walk to school. Look for drivers in parked cars. They may be getting ready to move.

#### Cross the street safely

- 1. Stop at the curb or edge of the street
- 2. Look left, right, left and behind you and in front of you for traffic.
- 3. Wait until no traffic is coming and begin crossing.
- 4. Keep looking for traffic until you have finished crossing.
- 5. Walk, don't run across the street.

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
