BIG NEWS - the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian "Share the Road" special license plate is out! It is available at your local NV DMV now! The plates look great! Be the the first one on your block to be bike cool.

All funds generated by the plate will go towards bicycle and pedestrian safety programs and projects in Nevada! Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board will oversee the program. 1,000 plates need to be sold in the first year and after that the number has to stay at 1,000 active plates annually to keep this effort alive! It only costs an extra \$61 to initially get one and then \$30 per

vear after that and of that \$25 the first year and \$20 annually goes directly to the fund.



Personalized plates (up to 5 letters) are also available!

Please show your support and get a set of "Share the Road" plates on every vehicle! I bought two sets myself! Note that you can get them anytime, not just at time of renewal. DMV will pro-rate the fees to the current year. Let's see the plates out there! What a better way to advertise that you are a bicyclist and proud of it!

Board Meeting Minutes—January 5, 2015

Called to order via teleconference at 6:05pm. December meeting minutes were approved.

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
 - **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is: \$34,859.34. The PayPal account balance is \$14,631.10
 - Membership: All members in good standing as
 of December 31 are in grace period until the end
 of April after which 2015 dues will be considered
 in arrears. Currently there are 104 individual
 members and 38 family memberships
 representing approximately 80 additional
 members.
 - Weekend Rides: The Board of Directors recommends more emphasis on moderate rides with a goal of attracting new members.
 - Newsletter: The next newsletter will be published after the February Board meeting.
 - Website: Michael is working on new content for the Challenge web site. However, no actual changes have been implemented. Also with regard to social media, Michael is planning to tie in Instagram and Twitter with Challenge marketing.
 - · Weekly Road Races: No report.
 - Mountain Bike Races: The position of Mountain Bike Coordinator is open. The Board of Directors would be most grateful for a volunteer to step forward and fill the position. Contact President Chris Rhiner.
 - Junior Team: No report.Spring Century: No report.
 - Pinenut Cracker: Robert Braun has volunteered to coordinate.
 - · King of Kingsbury Time Trial: No report.
 - · Bike Advocacy: No report.
 - Adopt A Highway: No scheduled clean up day at this point. Tammy De Giovanni is the 2015 Road Cleanup Coordinator.
 - Clothing: The Board is earnestly seeking a volunteer to act as Clothing Coordinator. Contact President Chris Rhiner.

- **Public Relations**: The Board is earnestly seeking a volunteer No report.
- Challenge: There are 75 online registrations to date for the 2015 ride. A designer is onboard designing a 2015 Challenge ride jersey. The 2015 Challenge posters and postcards are at the printers and will be similar to last year's except using photographs from the 2014 photo contest. The first advertisement for the 2015 Challenge, a quarter-page, will appear in the January issue of Cycle California. Another quarter page ad is scheduled for the February issue. Additional ads will appear in the following months with the size to be determined.
 - The Stanislaus National Forest is increasing permit fees for the Challenge ride.
- Insurance: A renewal packet has been sent from League of American Bicyclists (LAB). The annual premium, which covers club events, but not races, is \$2.97 per member with family memberships counting as two members. General liability coverage is \$1 million per occurrence with a \$5 million annual aggregate. Also included is \$10,000 per personal injury accident with a \$1,000 deductible. Additionally covered is equipment (bicycle) with a \$5,000 limit and \$1,000 deductible.
 The Directors and Officers insurance premium is
 - \$550 for \$1 million coverage. Motion 01/01: Authorize payment of 2015 LAB insurance premium. Chris Rhiner/Frank Dixon -- Carried unanimously.
- Club Officials for 2015: Motion 01/02: Appointment of Club Officials for 2015: Di Bolton, Weekly Road Races; Robert Braun, Pine Nut Cracker; Tammy Di Giovanni, Highway Cleanup and Tim Rowe, Bicycle Advocacy. Michael Bayer/ Tammy Lundquist -- Carried unanimously.
- Offsite Backups: Motion 01/03: Authorization for \$32.99 annual fee for cloud backup of the server. Chris Rhiner/ Tammy Lundquist -- Carried unanimously.
- Next Meeting: Monday, February 2, 2014, 6 pm at Jethro's in the Gardnerville Ranchos.

Meeting called to order at 6:10 pm Minutes of the January meeting approved as circulated

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: The current checking account balance is: \$31,030.68. The PayPal account balance is \$16.082.47.
- Membership: Family memberships: 38.
 Individuals: 104.
- Weekend Rides: See below.
- Newsletter: Waiting on content for the February issue.
- Website: The club owns four web domains: altaalpina.org, altaalpina.com altaalpinacyclingclub.com, altaalpinachallenge.com. The altaalpinacyclingclub.com domain registration fee has expired. The Board's decision is to pay for a five-year term, assuming the fee is in line with other domain registrations.
- Weekly Road Races: http://www.altaalpina.org/ clubracesroad/ Tentative start date: April 16.
- Mountain Bike Races: The position of Mountain Bike Coordinator is open. The Board of Directors would be most grateful for a volunteer to step forward and fill the position. Contact President Chris Rhiner.
- · Junior Team: No report.
- Spring Century: Date is set for May 24-- details TBD. Motion 02/01: Continue describing the ride as the Ray Rickard Memorial Century. Chris Rhiner/Tammy Lundquist -- Carried unanimously.
- Pinenut Cracker: Date: Saturday, May 16. The USA Cycling Mountain Bike National Championships will be at Mammoth Mountain, July 15-19. The possibility is being explored of having this year's Pinenut Cracker as a USA Cycling district championship and a qualifying race for Mammoth. District championship or not, the event will be USA Cycling sanctioned.
- · King of Kingsbury Time Trial: Date TBD.

- · Cyclocross Race: No report.
- Bike Advocacy: Nevada DMV bicycling license plate is now available. President Chris Rhiner claims to have bought the first one issued at the Carson City DMV office. The requirement for this license plate to be a viable program is that 1000 plates must be sold in the first year of issue. If the 1000 number is not reached, then NV DMV will continue to support the existing plates, but no more will be available.
 - The state of Nevada has just finished application to League of American Bicyclists for the latest "Bike Friendly" state ranking. Carson City achieved "Bike Friendly" status.
- · Adopt A Highway: No report.
- Clothing: No report.
- · Public Relations: Challenge posters and rack cards are printed and distributed to bicycle shops and hotels in Carson Valley and Woodfords. The cards and posters are to be distributed to Markleeville this week. A press release has been issued regarding the opening of registration for the 2015 Challenge ride. Challenge accommodation information has been updated on the web site. Challenge information is being disseminated on social media site. Wayne has been in discussion with the Carson Valley Visitor's Authority to match the club's advertising dollars in exchange for the club promoting Carson Valley bicycling. With Curtis Fong's "Tour of Carson Valley" being the week before the Challenge, the possibility of a promotion: "Cycle Sierra Week" was discussed. The assumption being that such a program would beneficial to AACC, Curtis, and CVVA and possibly result in additional advertising help with the Challenge from CVVA. Ideas and commentary on the Cycle Sierra Week are welcome. Send to Wayne at sierracyclopath@gmail.com.
- Challenge: Planning is in the advertising phase.
 Ads have appeared in Cycle California for two months with a third ad coming. Budget for the



- event is close to being finished—waiting on Forest Service costs. To date, 110 registrations have been received.
- Insurance: The latest renewal of League of American Bicyclists (LAB) liability insurance has come with added requirements for club rides coverage. Perhaps most significantly, that guests may only join in one club ride before becoming members and the need for timely reporting of any accidents on club rides.
- 2. Gang-of-Five: Motion 02/02: To adopt a plan expanding the weekly ride leader program with the title: "Gang of Five". Michael Bayer/Chris Rhiner -- Carried unanimously. As currently envisioned, the Gang of Five will add five appointed ride leaders to the weekend rides program in addition to the currently elected Ride Leader. The result of the program is to have each of the five lead one ride each month from April though October, so there will be at least one ride every weekend and sometimes two rides. By the expansion of the weekend rides program it is hoped that membership will increase.
- 3. **Officials for 2015:** Motion 02/03: To re-appoint Joe Marzocco as Web Site Coordinator for 2015.

- Michael Bayer/Chris Rhiner -- Carried unanimously.
- 4. Dues and Membership Drive for 2015: A proposal was made, with the Board's approval, to authorize the local bicycle shops to grant a oneyear's free membership to Alta Alpina Cycling Club with the purchase of a new bicycle during the period from mid-March until the AACC Spring Party. The rational being that the club could benefit from possible new members by inviting them to the Spring Party. The participating shops could benefit, if the buyer became an AACC member, by possibly encouraging the rider to ride more and thereby consume more bicycle shop goods and services. Motion 02/04: Dues amount will continue to be the same as for 2014. Extend free membership for the first year anyone buying a new bicycle from a local bicycle shop during a promotional period from March 15 until the date of the Spring Party Michael Bayer /Tammy Lundquist -- Carried unanimously.
- Next Meeting: Monday, March 2, 2015, 6 pm at Lakeside Casino, 168 U.S. 50, Stateline.
