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AACC Weekend Ride Schedule—June/July

We have a full schedule for the month of June but we need volunteers to lead more rides in the 20-30 mile range.

Saturday, June 10, 2017 — South Tahoe Cruiser & BBQ

This is a shorter and more casual ride of 25-30 miles at an easy pace. Meet at Dave Scarborough's house at 11:00am (see address posted on website rideboard). Our route will head out Pioneer Trail and through Christmas Valley and back. We will BBQ leftovers from the Spring Century afterwards. Please let us know if you are coming so we know how much food to defrost (davescar30@gmail.com or call (530)318-7878).

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Sunday, June 11, 2017 — Ride around Lake Tahoe & BBQ

Meet at Dave Scarborough's house, ready to ride, at 9:00am (see address

posted on website rideboard). We'll ride clockwise around the lake at a medium casual pace—a distance of about 72 miles. We will have snacks and BBQ leftovers from the Spring Century afterwards. Please let us know if you are coming so we know how much food to defrost (davescar30@gmail.com or call (530)318-7878).

Saturday, June 17, 2017 — Kingsbury-Luther

Meet at Genoa Town Park on Nixon Street (Nixon is just the continuation of Genoa Lane) in Genoa at 9:00am. We'll ride up Kingsbury to Lake Tahoe, to Pioneer Trail to old South Upper Truckee Road, and over Luther Pass, down Woodfords Canyon and back along Foothill to the start, for about 4500 feet of climbing. This is a club weekend ride, so we'll have drinks and snacks afterwards.

Saturday, June 24, 2017 — Ride the Open Passes

This is a club weekend ride in place of the cancelled Alta Alpina Challenge for club members and guests joining us for the first time. (New members can join at the start.) At 8:00am we'll ride from Turtle Rock Park to Luther Pass, Carson Pass, the closed gate on Blue Lakes Road, and return to Turtle Rock Park (about 50 miles) with regroups at each intersection and turn-around. After snacks, we'll start the second half of the ride at 2:00pm and we'll ride both sides of Monitor Pass (another 50 miles). We'll return to Turtle Rock Park for more drinks and snacks. Join us for the morning or the afternoon or both. If you're looking for extra miles, start earlier than 8:00am, ride Kingsbury and then catch up to the group on the way to Luther Pass.

Sunday June 25, 2017 — Virginia City via Geiger

Meet at the Savemart on Carson street in north Carson City ready to ride at 9:30am. We'll ride north around Washoe Lake into Reno and up Geiger grade and return the way we came for about 50 miles.

Sunday July 2, 2017 — Blue Lakes Out and Back

Meet at Dave Scarborough's house, ready to ride, at 9:00am (see address posted on website rideboard). We'll ride out to the base of Old Myers Grade at South Upper Truckee. Those who want to start there can meet the group at 9:45am. We'll climb Luther Pass and arrive at the start of Blue Lakes Rd. to meet anyone looking for a shorter ride at 11:30am. Mileage options are 70, 50, and 24 respectively.

Sunday July 9, 2017 — Genoa to Diamond Valley

Meet at Genoa Town Park on Nixon Street (Nixon is just the continuation of Genoa Lane) in Genoa at 9:00am for a casual paced ride out to and around Diamond Valley for about 42 miles.

Board Meeting Minutes—June 5, 2017

Secretary: Garth Jackson; Other Board Members: Michael Bayer (Membership coordinator, Challenge Ride Director, Newsletter editor), Francis Dixon (Treasurer), Garth Jackson (Secretary), James Sadilek (Website administrator), Chris Rhiner (Club president), Tammy Lundquist (Club vice president), Dave Scarborough (Spring/Fall Century Ride Organizer, Weekend ride coordinator)

Minutes from 5/1/17 approved [Frank/Garth] Passed

- 1. Monthly Status Reports:
 - Treasurer: The current checking account balance is \$14,776.92. The Paypal balance is \$3,761.82. Event Income to be deposited: ~\$700. Clothing orders processed through Paypal. Cycle California invoice remains to be paid. Race stewards need to be issued a W-9 for tax purposes. Check requisition will be used to issue future race steward payments.
 - Membership: Number of members presently renewed for 2017 is 149. Chris requests list of members with associated information to provide a means of contacting club members should the club membership database fail. Dennis is rewriting the application to interact with the club membership database. Michael is doing research to determine ways to strengthen the relationship with local bike stores and the cycling customers they serve. (Do members use the shop discount often? What should the club provide to bike shops?) Frank and Dave will solicit similar feedback from Lake Tahoe area stores
 - Weekend Rides: The group has rides posted for each weekend through June. The weekend rides have kept an inventory of food and drinks for some time. The ride leader will work on

- consuming this inventory and picking up ride snacks and drinks on an as-needed basis. Tentative date for Gold Lakes camp and ride weekend is set for July 19-20.
- Spring Century: Many thanks go to Eric Reuter for use of his home as ride and BBQ headquarters. Volunteers from the club made the ride operation smooth and BBQ wellorchestrated. Rider count was 62 for the day. BoD discussed riders who show up and become members for the Spring Century only and don't volunteer for other events.
- Newsletter: Release of the newsletter is gated by the meeting minutes and the presidential posting. Secretary Garth needs to get faster at incorporating feedback from BoD into the draft document. The club membership card is an item that some members may see as a valuable part of the printed newsletter. The BoD concluded that a membership card could be printed from an electronic version of the newsletter without significant difficulty.
- Website: The indefatigable website coordinator
 Jim has contracted Blue Host to host the Alta
 Alpina website and mail server. The bill for the
 domain switch was presented at the rates
 advertised at the previous monthly meeting.
 (\$214.20 for three years, and \$15.99 per domain



transfer). Email service can be administered by the club through the Blue Host servers. Changeover date from the previous provider is 19-Jun-2017.

- Weekly Road Races: Timing system has been working well for the road races. Results have been posted as early as 8:30pm the same day.
- Junior Team: Junior mountain bike group will start practices in July.
- Bike Advocacy: Three BoD members attended the NDOT meeting to gather public feedback on how to make road around Zephyr Cove and Round Hill safer. More information on the NDOT website: https://www.nevadadot.com/home/showdocument?id=8003.
- Adopt A Highway: Cleanup day on 5/7/17 went well. Not a gigantic turnout, but not too much trash to clean up either.
- Clothing: Chris has transferred the inventory of fashion kits to Lori, who is the club clothing coordinator. The vendor of the fashion kits allows online orders directly from club members. This allows the club to minimize physical inventory. Members can contact Chris Rhiner via the president email if they have inquiries about the fashion kit.
- Challenge: Refunds to registered riders for 2017 have been processed. A weekend ride starting from Turtle Rock Park is planned for the weekend

- that would have been the Challenge ride.
- Pinenut Cracker: Members who are interested in acting as race director for this event are encouraged to get more details from a BoD member, or fellow club members.
- Carson City Epic MTB: Carson City Epic MTB
 race happens in two weeks. The course for this
 event has been condensed to lower elevations due
 to the amount of snow in the valley and up at Lake
 Tahoe.
- 3. Challenge in 2018: The board discussed how to proceed in 2018. Idea 1: Focus on the double century in order to simplify the logistics of running rest stops on the course. (Of the riders who registered for the Challenge, 40% signed up for the double century.) Idea 2: Expand the number of organizations we partner with to help man rest stops on the course. Idea 3: Recruit three additional people in the short term to begin work on the 2018 event: 'Volunteer Coordinator', Registration Coordinator', 'Marketing Coordinator'. Michael will perform mathematics to determine the optimal format to maximize the income to effort ratio. Motion by Dave Scarborough, second Chris Rhiner. Motion: The club will carry on with the AACC Challenge scheduled for June 30, 2018. [Chris/Dave] Passed Unanimously.
- Next Meeting: Monday, July 10, 2017, 6 pm, Jethro's in Gardnerville Ranchos.
 Meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm
