

Upcoming Rides

Here are a few events to start planning for today:

Sunday, March 15, 2015 — WEEKEND RIDE: Woodfords to the top of Monitor

Meet in the upper parking area at Woodfords. Under the big pine trees, ready to roll by 11:00am. There will be 25 and 40 mile options. We'll ride out to the base of Monitor. Those wanting the shorter option will turn back and the rest of the group will climb Monitor. (If Monitor is closed we'll go to the closure on Ebbetts.)

Saturday, March 21, 2015 — WEEKEND RIDE: Virginia City/Louse Town Loop via 6 Mile Canyon

Meet at the Governor's Field parking lot on South Roop Street in Carson City, ready to roll by 10:00am. Ride the quiet roads east of Carson City, up to Virginia City, up Gieger Grade, Virginia Highlands, Lousetown, back to Virginia City and return to Carson City. Some of the ride is on Highway 50, a little noisy but there's a good shoulder to ride on. Be ready for mostly very nice roads, some great views, and about 4000 feet of climbing.

Saturday, March 28, 2015 — WEEKEND RIDE: Omo Ranch Road Loop

Meet at Minden Starbucks to carpool at 8:30am. We'll start the ride from the south side of the junction of Hwy 88 and Shake Ridge Road at 10:30am. We'll ride a 60 mile loop which will take in Fiddletown Road, Plymouth, CA, Shenandoah, and Omo Ranch Road. The roads are all fair to good pavement.

Saturday, April 4, 2015 — WEEKEND RIDE: Carson-East-Jack's Valley Loop

Meet at Big Daddy's Bicycle & Fitness (1546 Highway 395 in Gardnerville) at 10:00am. Ride the Pine Nut loop to East Valley to Stephanie-395-Sunridge-Jacks Valley Rd-Centerville. Everyone welcome, pace (or paces) dependent on who participants. We'll have regular re-groups along the way and there are multiple bailout spots for those who need to cut the loop short. The full loop is about 50 miles.

Saturday, April 11, 2015 — Tierra Bella Bicycle Ride

Join Almaden Cycle Touring Club (ACTC) on their 37th annual Tierra Bella Bicycle Tour. There are four route options on pretty roads in Santa Clara County. - 2. Ride as many miles as you can over 5 weeks starting on March 15 (the Ides of March).
- 3. Record the number of miles you ride each day and where your rode. If you ride dirt, those miles count for double.
- 4. Bring your mileage log to the Spring Party on April 20. You must be present to win!

We'll announce the three men and three women who rode the furthest. The man and woman who log the most miles will each win a prize. A prize will also be awarded to a third person who logged their miles chosen at random from everyone else who submits a mileage log. So everyone who enters has a chance to win!



Come to Tahoe and experience the breathtaking scenic beauty of classic, wild sierra roadways and panoramas on some of the best pavement you'll find on any organized ride. The route travels through wilderness areas—there are no traffic lights and just a dozen stop signs. Choose your favorite pass(es) or pick one of these popular routes:

THE FOOTHILL FUN RIDES

Take in the views of Diamond Valley, Carson Valley, and/or the Carson River Canyon with options from 15 to 37 miles.

THE WILD SIERRA METRIC

Featuring Luther Pass and Blue Lakes Road along with a scenic loop through Diamond Valley, this is a beautiful 64 mile ride with 5000 feet of climbing.

THE WILD SIERRA CENTURY

The Wild Sierra Century features three passes: Kingsbury, Ebbetts East, and Monitor West. This is a challenging 110 mile ride with 11000 feet of climbing.

5 PASS CHALLENGE

A classic combination of passes: Carson, both sides of Ebbetts, and both sides of Monitor. We add Diamond Valley and Emigrant Trail for a scenic warmup for a ride that is 134 miles with over 16,000 feet of of climbing.

8 PASS CHALLENGE

This is the ultimate single day ride—the world's toughest double century with over 20,300 feet of climbing, nearly half over 7000 feet of altitude, Those who complete this challenge earn the right to wear the 8 Pass Finisher Jersey.

Board Meeting Minutes—March 2, 2015

Meeting called to order at 6:14 pm

1. Presentation by Charles Pankey: Mr. Pankey made a presentation to the Board regarding AACC Challenge advertising in the Adventure Sports Journal magazine. The recommendation from Mr. Pankey was that the Board should consider a two months advertisement for the months of April and May at a cost of \$250. Pankey described the April/May issue as a "keeper issue" because it contains a season long bicycling calendar. The consensus of the directors was that the advertising campaign should cover the months of April, May and June. June being the month where one-third of the Challenge registrations are received. Final decision is dependent on budget

2. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer**: The checking account balance is \$34,251.97. The Paypal balance is \$17,005.23.
- Membership: Spring Membership Party will be April 20, 6:00pm at CVIC in downtown Minden— 1604 Esmeralda Street. Rental cost to AACC is charged at the non-profit rate of \$162.50 Motion 03/01: Set a budget amount of \$1000 (based on last year's budget) for the Spring Membership Party. Frank Dixon/Tammy Lundquist -- Carried unanimously.
- Weekend Rides: Member Alex Kuhlmann requests to be part of the Gang of Five to lead mountain bike rides. Motion 03/02: Appoint Alex Kuhlmann to the Gang of Five as a mountain bike ride leader. Michael Bayer/Garth Jackson --Carried unanimously.
- Newsletter: Anticipated publication date is 3/9.
- Website: There was discussion regarding possible changes to the web site, but no decisions were made.
- Weekly Road Races: The 2015 Thursday night road race schedule is nearly complete, insurance details remain to be finalized.

- Mountain Bike Races: The Board of Directors would be most grateful for a volunteer to step forward and fill this position. Contact President Chris Rhiner.
- Junior Team: Randy Jacobs and Kate Blake have volunteered to lead Junior Team rides on Monday and Friday.
- Spring Century: The Ray Rickard Spring Century is set for May 24. Post ride party at Tina Keegan's, off Centerville Road. See AACC Ride Board for details. More information will be in the April newsletter.
- Pinenut Cracker: No report.
- Cyclocross Race: No report.
- · Bike Advocacy: No report.
- Adopt A Highway: Next clean up day scheduled for Sunday June 7 8:00am at Turtle Rock park.
 Tammy will provide coffee and yummy bagels.
- Clothing: The Board is earnestly seeking a volunteer to act as Clothing Coordinator. Contact President Chris Rhiner.
- Public Relations/Publicity: Larger regional newspapers, Reno Gazette, Sacramento Bee, no longer print Challenge press releases. They suggest social media. Record Courier has printed several articles. Laura Caimi continues to post Challenge information on Facebook. Local online sites, Sierra REC, Carson Valley Times and Carson Now are publishing AACC/ Challenge press releases. Challenge lodging accommodations information is up to date. Dining information inquiries are not getting responses. Laura is co-promoting the Challenge with regional rides: Terra Bella, 04/11; Cinderella, 04/18; Chico Wildflower, 04/26 and Planet Ultra Solvang Century 10/17. Wayne Treloggen, who has done an outstanding job of publicizing AACC and most especially the Challenge, informs the Board he will be leaving his position to travel (new volunteer is needed).



- Challenge: For the month of February, 12 Challenge registrations were received. February is traditionally a very slow month for Challenge registrations. Michael continues to work on a new Challenge web site. Challenge insurance arrangements for the 2015 event are complete. Michael asks for descriptions, from a rider's point of view, of each Challenge pass as if it were a separate ride. The descriptions to be included in the new web site to assist those building their own ride to make decisions about which passes to include in the choices. Tammy Lundquist suggested having magnetic vinyl automobile signs made up to publicize the Challenge. The rationale being that members traveling to area rides could place the signs on their automobiles.
- 3. Alta Alpina Challenge Budget: Michael Bayer presented the 2015 Challenge budget document and outlined unknowns and risks that include a possible increase in USFS permit fees. A suggestion was made to substitute bandannas, with an image of the Challenge map, rather than T-shirts for the Challenge. Michael will investigate this option. Motion 03/02: Approve 2015Challenge budget. Michael Bayer/Frank Dixon -- Carried unanimously.
