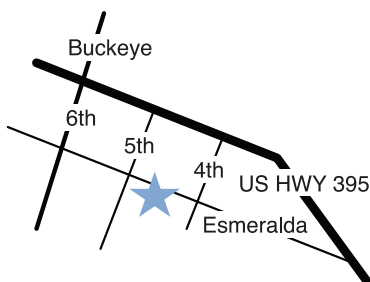

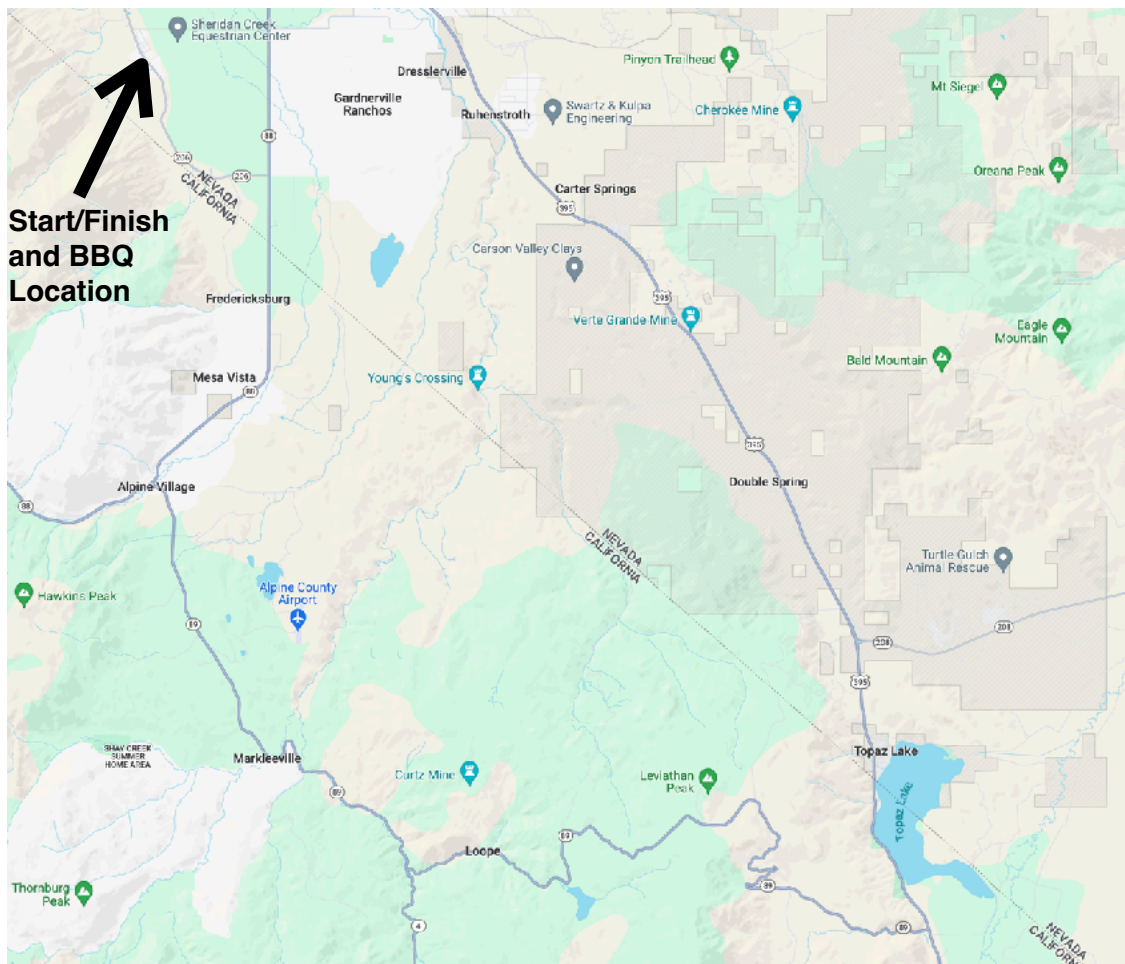

Leon Malméd will speak of his parents' deportation and consequent deaths at the Auschwitz concentration/death camp. He will speak about Antisemitism and its history. He and his sister were hidden by a French Christian couple and their two sons. He shares the heroic promise made by the neighbors who, at the risk of their own lives, chose to care for and protect Leon and his sister from the Nazi regime the three years duration of the German occupation. Leon and his sister Rachel Malméd survived the famine and the 24/7 fear for their life. He speaks of finding joy in the small things such as the orange he received for Christmas, but most of all he took comfort in the loving and courageous acts of his neighbors who saved his and his sister's life. He encourages the students to value the privileges that come with freedom, especially education. He implored them to learn history, in order to make a stand for Peace.

Board Meeting Minutes—March 3, 2025

Meeting held by Zoom

Meeting called to order at 6:06 pm

Minutes of the February meeting approved as amended to correct meeting date. [Nigel I Joseph I Unanimous]

1. Monthly Status Reports:

- **Treasurer:** The current checking account balance is \$9,048.40. The Paypal balance is \$962.83. CDs are currently at \$12,000.00, \$12,005.27 and \$10,896.28. Bill reported that he received a donation check from Judy Guinn.
- **Membership:** 2025 renewals and new memberships are coming in. Michael is working on all the elements of the membership database that need to be updated for 2025.
- **Weekend Rides:** Lyn reported that he scheduled two rides this month and the first one was very well attended. Lyn will be calling another rider leaders meeting in the third week of March. Lyn is also recruiting Spring Roundup ride leaders.
- **Weekly MTB Rides:** Weekly rides will start in April.
- **Social Media:** No report.
- **Newsletter:** Next newsletter is scheduled for March 17.
- **Website:** Greg has been working on the DRTS website. He has also updated the calendar page for 2025 and is working on updates to the MTB page.
- **Insurance:** The decision was made not to renew the non-owned auto policy. We still need a racing policy.
- **Clothing:** Michael working on getting the 2025 kit ordering window set for delivery by the Cyclorama.
- **Weekly Road Races:** The Webscorer team updated the software on the RFID

reader which Joseph has tested and used to program new chips. New chip labels were printed and he is now working on 3D printing new chip holders for final assembly. We need a race coordinator for the 2025 season. At a minimum this position has to be filled for certain dates when Joseph will be traveling. Michael can tow the porta potty and help with staging and check-in but someone will still be required to oversee the race. Joseph noted that Grandview & Eagle Ridge should be listed as named insured on the race insurance policy.

- **Junior Team:** No report.
 - **Cyclorama:** Chris is preparing material for the next two newsletters.
 - **Fall Century:** No report.
 - **Adopt A Highway:** Jordan confirmed all the cleanup dates for 2025.
 - **Death Ride Training Series:** Michael reported that twelve people have registered so far. Five were already-registered for the Death Ride and one was someone who registered for the DRTS through the pop-up on the Death Ride registration page but the source of the other registrations is unknown. We need to recruit coaches, ride leaders, and SAG volunteers for each of the five rides.
2. **Housekeeping:** Grace Period expiration date April 30 [Michael I BNBill I Unanimous]. Geoff Blachman and Timari Pruis are appointed as NICA Team Coach and NICA Team Director respectively [Michael I Nigel I Unanimous]. An Honorary Membership is extended to club founder Curtis Fong [Michael I Nigel I Unanimous]. Current draft of club calendar cleared for distribution to other organizations.
